

Mabey Pond



Description: The preservation of Mabey pond will allow the Clearfield City to keep the property in its natural state for the enjoyment of area residents as a passive recreation area. The pond will be an added amenity to the city wide park system as it is centrally located and convenient to many residents. It can be used by residents as an urban fishery as well as for non-motorized boating.

Location: Mabey Pond is located to the west of 310 South 500 East in Clearfield.

Acreage: 2.31 acres

Grant funding: \$45,412

Total Project Cost: \$90,824

Public Benefits

Open Space: Mabey Pond is located in a heavily populated residential area. The preservation of the pond will assure that it will remain open space for generations to come.

Recreation: The Division of Wildlife Resources (DWR) is working with the Clearfield City to turn Mabey Pond into an urban fishery. The DWR will assist with the installation of a dock and a perimeter trail as well as stocking the pond with fish. Non-motorized boats will also be allowed on the pond
